Structure, Governance and management

The principal address of the charity is Scout HQ, Dunyeats Road, Broadstone.

The Group's governing documents are those of The Scout Association. They consist of a Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to the Bye Laws of the Association and The Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

The Group is a trust established under its rules that are common to all Scouts.

The Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

The Group is an educational charity that is managed by the Group Executive Committee, the members of which are the 'Charity Trustees' of the Scout Group.

As charity trustees they are responsible for complying with legislation applicable to charities. This includes the registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate.

This Group Executive Committee exists to support the Group Scout Leader in meeting the responsibilities of the appointments and is responsible for:

The maintenance of Group property;

The raising of funds and the administration of Group finance;

The insurance of persons, property and equipment;

Group public occasions;

Assisting in the recruitment of leaders and other adult support;

Appointing any sub committees that may be required;

Appointing Group Administrators and Advisors other than those who are elected.

The Committee consists of 3 independent representatives, Chair, Treasurer and Secretary, together with the Group Scout Leaders, individual section leaders and parents' representation and meets every 3 months.

Risk and internal control

The group has in place systems of internal controls that are designed to provide reasonable assurance against material mismanagement or loss; these include 2 signatories for all payments and comprehensive insurance policies to ensure that insurable risks are covered.

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the group are as a unit of the Scout Association.

The Aim of The Scout Association is to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials, as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local national and international communities. The method of achieving the Aim of the Association is by providing an enjoyable and attractive scheme of progressive training, based on the Scout Promise and Law and guided by adult leadership.

Achievements and performance

For the financial year 2020-21, the covid pandemic had a significant impact on the Broadstone Scout Group. The Group continued to provide successful Scouting activities although some of this switched to be virtual, including camps. From a financial perspective, the major items that impacted the accounts were:

- 1) the temporary reduction in subs that was implemented at the time of the first national lockdown.
- the receipt of covid related grants (£10k from BCP recorded under donations).
- 3) restrictions on face to face activities, reducing the cash flow through the accounts.
- 4) refund of £6k monies for summer camp, included in camp expenses.

Financial review

Total receipts amounted to £18,415 (2020 £48,953) against which expenditure of £23,636 (2020 £37,005) was incurred, resulting in a net deficit of £5,221 (2020 net surplus of £11,948).

Reserves policy

The Group's policy on reserves is to hold sufficient resources to continue the charitable activities of the group should income and fundraising activities fall short. The Group Executive Committee considers that the group should hold a sum equivalent to 12 months cost of central fixed costs.

Investment policy

Given the UK's current financial uncertainty following the EU referendum result, the Group has adopted a risk averse strategy to the investment of its funds. All funds are held in cash using only mainstream banks or short-term investments funds administered by the Scout Association amounting to £4,808 (2019 £4,808).
